Christian Høegh-Andersen is 52 years old and has been Chairman of the Board of the seed corporation DLF since 2013. Before that, he was Vice-Chairman for two years, and entered the Board in 2003.

DLF is among the world's largest seed corporations, with more than 2,000 employees in over 20 countries on five continents. DLF is the global market leader within temperate grass and clover seeds, and provides seeds to more than 100 countries. DLF operates within forage and turf seeds, sugar and fodder beet seeds, potato seeds and multiplication of vegetable seeds. DLF is owned by a cooperative of Danish grass-seed farmers. Last financial year, the turnover was DKK 7.5 billion (around EUR 1 billion).

Christian Høegh-Andersen is educated as an agronomist and runs an arable farm on the island of Falster, in the south-eastern part of Denmark, with a crop rotation of sugar beets, malt barley, wheat and grass seeds. He is married to Kirsten, a veterinarian and owner of a veterinary hospital in Maribo, and together they have three children.

Christian Høegh-Andersen is the newest member of the Danish Agriculture and Food Council's top political management, the Joint Presidency, which he joined in December 2021.
